International Student Statistics Fall 2021

Background Information

These statistics represent a snapshot of the international student population at the University of New Mexico taken in the Fall 2021 semester and are largely the same as those reported to "Open Doors", the national survey published by the Institute of International Education (IIE). Although the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on enrollments was not as great in fall 2021 as in fall 2020, some new students were still unable to begin studies at the University of New Mexico due to embassy closures and other COVID-related factors, and some current students were forced to withdraw from the University for financial, travel and other factors caused by the pandemic. Therefore, the increase in the overall number of enrolled students is not as large as it would have been without the continuing effects of the pandemic.

For purposes of this report the definition of "International students" listed below includes 3 groups: 1) academic degree-seeking students on non-immigrant visas, 2) all intensive English students enrolled in the CELAC program, and 3) all full-time exchange/guest or non-degree students coming from abroad and enrolled at UNM for the fall 2021 semester. "Exchange/Guest" students are those who are visiting UNM for one semester or one year as a part of an official agreement between UNM and a university abroad. Exchange agreements are bilateral, while Guest agreements only involve students coming to UNM. Those listed as "non-degree" international students are in UNM certificate programs.


Students are only counted in one group in this report. For example, if a student is enrolled primarily as an Exchange student, but is taking intensive English classes, she is only included in the Exchange numbers and not in the Intensive English numbers. Students on "practical training" are shown in the first chart only. These students are authorized and monitored by an international advisor at UNM to engage in work in their field following completion of their program of study. Practical training students are still on F or J visas sponsored by UNM but are typically no longer attending UNM as full-time students. Please note that these "practical training" students are not included in any other statistics in this report.


Observations

- The total number of enrolled international students increased by 4.75% over Fall 2020.
- Changes over last year (by level):
 - Undergraduate students decreased 12.7%
 - o Graduate students increased 10.71% (9.52% increase in Master's students and 11.32% increase in Doctoral students),
 - Intensive English students increased 9.09%
 - o 'Practical training' students (students on post-completion work permission) decreased 1.84%
 - Exchange students increased 142.86%
 - Non-degree students increased 28.57%
- Over the last five years (Fall 2021 compared with Fall 2017), there has been
 - o 12.23% decrease in the number of undergraduate students
 - o 10.14% decrease in graduate students (21.59% decrease in Master's students and 3.05% decrease in Doctoral students)
 - o 66.67% decrease in the exchange student population
 - o 80.95% decrease in the Intensive English student population.
- Of all International students enrolled at UNM for Fall 2021, 61.08% were Graduates, 31.82% were Undergraduates, 5.02% were Exchange students, 0.89% were Non-degree/Certificate program students and 1.18% were Intensive English students.
- International students comprised 4.69% of the total full-time UNM main campus student population (12.63% of all graduates excluding Medicine and Law schools at UNM and 2.15% of all undergraduates at UNM).
- International students at UNM come from 96 countries; the top 5 countries represented at UNM are: China, India, Nepal, Bangladesh, and Iran, respectively
- In terms of region of origin, Asia has the largest representation at 54.48% of international students
- 43.94% of international students receive more than half of their funding from UNM
- 56.06% of international students at the University of New Mexico receive the majority of their support from sources outside of
 UNM. Thus, international students who pay non-resident rates contribute a considerable number of tuition dollars to UNM each
 year. Based on reported sources of income and tuition-residency status, the total amount these students spent on tuition this
 year was approximately 19.1 million dollars.






Categories of "Exchange/Guest" students with Payment Types
